> *Affects: All FreeBSD 4.x releases prior to 4.10-RELEASE*

As a few people have noted, this should read "FreeBSD 4.8 and 4.9"; this bug never existed in earlier versions of FreeBSD.

That said, FreeBSD 4.7 and earlier are no longer officially supported, and it is highly recommended that people upgrade to a newer version, since there have been recent security advisories concerning issues to which earlier releases are still vulnerable.

> *1) Upgrade your vulnerable system to 4.10-RELEASE, or to the RELENG_4_8*

> *or RELENG_4_9 security branch dated after the correction date.*

3) If you are running an affected release, you can use FreeBSD Update:

```
# cd /usr/ports/security/freebsd-update && make all install
```

```
# cp /usr/local/etc/freebsd-update.conf.sample /usr/local/etc/freebsd-update.conf
```

```
# /usr/local/sbin/freebsd-update fetch
```

```
# /usr/local/sbin/freebsd-update install
```
