Recently, during testing of a new XP SP2 image, we found one of our applications which integrates with Office 2003 SP1 (Outlook) could not connect via VPN. The really strange thing was that last year's image - XP SP1 / Office 2003 - had no problem even after applying XPSP2 and Office2k3 SP1 to it.

On a hunch (in desperation?), I tried applying a fix described in MSKB Q244474 - How to force Kerberos to use TCP instead of UDP in Windows Server 2003, in Windows XP, and in Windows 2000 - <http://support.microsoft.com/default.aspx?scid=kb:en-us:Q244474> which fixed the problem!

Hope this helps.
