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Resin DOS Device Path Disclosure

SUMMARY

It is possible to disclose the physical path to the web root. This information could be useful to a malicious user wishing to gain illegal access to resources on the server.

DETAILS

Vulnerable systems:

* Resin 2.1.1 on Windows 2000 Server

* Resin 2.1.2 on Windows 2000 Server

Immune systems:

* Resin 2.1.s020711 on Windows 2000 Server

Requesting certain DOS devices, such as lpt9.xtp, results in an error message that contains the physical path to the web root.

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Vendor response:

The vendor was notified on 22 May 2002. On 12 July, we verified that the problem was corrected in the latest build (s020711).

Corrective action:
