I am not sure what do you mean by "ever changing realm", but you can adapt the following perl code to brute force your way in. You need to install Crypt::SSLeay module, dictionary, a loop and ... pretty much it...

```
#!/usr/bin/perl -w
use LWP::UserAgent;

my $ua = LWP::UserAgent->new;
my $req = HTTP::Request->new(POST => 'https://server.domain.com/');
$req->authorization_basic('foo', 'bar');
$res = $ua->request($req);
($res->is_success)? print $res->content, "\n" : print $res->status_line, "\n";
```
