> *I've configured ICQ to load at startup, when the system boots up, all I*

> *is the ICQ net detect icon in my system tray. To load ICQ, I have to click*

> *on that icon. Once I have clicked on it, ICQ loads, connects, and runs as*

> *before.*

> *However, ICQ will not automatically load at startup. This is weird since*

> *with the static IP address configuration, msn messenger, yahoo messenger,*

> *and aol instant messenger will all load at startup.*
