> Yes, you can allow access through the firewall to FTP server, web > servers, whatever you want to, you can even allow custom protocols (or > port numbers). But, there's only two real interfaces, one for the WAN > side (with 2 ports), and one for the LAN side (with 8 switched ports). > That means that the "DMZ" server (and it only allows for one DMZ IP) is > on the same subnet as your other LAN equipment, thus not really a DMZ.
