PS> Assuming OpenSSH/Sun SSH: man sshd_config, search for

PS> ListenAdress.

If you do this yourself, you will see that ListenAdress only allows you to specify a hostname or address, not an interface as the poster is asking.

OP, OpenSSH doesn't do what you want -- I would have it bind to 0.0.0.0, and use a packet filter to limit access to the appropriate interface.

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
