How can I make a PuTTY session more "raw"? Such as disabling ^S and ^Q, disabling PGUP/PGDN/HOME/END, all of that sort of thing? Ideally, every single keypress or keycombo (other than ones Windows intercepts before PuTTY gets them) would be sent verbatim, and only the mouse would remain untrapped.
