Thanks for your advice. I read the article and tried to implement its recommendations, but without any success. I also tried your recommendation of removing the <location> tags but that didn't produce any results either.

I am starting to believe that the <location> tag does not do what its documentation says it can do. No matter what I try to do, I can't seem to get back to my Child/Default page.

I would really appreciate hearing from anyone who can shed more light on implementing the <location> tag in a parent IIS application directory and have it successfully control a child IIS application directory. The documentation yields a lot of promise but the reality seems to be somewhat less.
