Mark,

What trust level is set for ASP.NET on your machine? (You can check this is in the %WINDIR%\Microsoft.NET\Framework\v2.0.<build>\CONFIG\web.config file.) If it's not full trust, then you'll need to ensure that both your ASP.NET application and your other assembly are granted the necessary EventLogPermission under the policy specified in the appropriate web_<level>trust.config file.

That said, writing to the event log from a web application is not necessarily such a wonderful idea in the first place. If feasible, it might be a better solution to log to a different target rather than adjusting your application's permissions to allow writing to the event log.
