

Re: Proxy auth with default credentials

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Ok, I'm still getting my head around the whole windows security setup, but from what you've said my understanding is:
I can't auth with kerberos to the proxy, impersonation is a function of kerberos, so I won't be able to authenticate against the proxy with an impersonated user.

I'm happy I can't do that, but seeing as I'm impersonating the user on the IIS box, I've therefore got a thread running as mydomain\myuser on the IIS box. Why can't I use that users credentials to create something I can assign to the proxy object so I can use with NTLM authentication (which does work against the proxy)?

Basically I'm trying to get a way of creating a System.Net.NetworkCredential with the details of the user IIS is impersonating – I just can't see how to do it?

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
