>My company has a public website hosted on a Win2k server
>using IIS. I've setup a virtual directory under the
>default website and pointed it to my intranet website,
>which is hosted on the same server. i want it to be
>secure, so i've setup a public certiicate and 128 bit
>security, and i've selected 'basic authentication' and
>required SSL to access the page. when i test it inside
>my LAN, it works fine, the page loads the certificate and
>asks for a user id and password, then loads the page.
>
>the problem is when i test it outside the LAN. when i
>try to load the page, it just gives the 'page cannot be
>displayed' message. I am using the https prefix. it
>never says anything about the certificate or asks for a
>password, it just goes to the 404 page. any help is
>appreciated!!
