I'm not 100% sure IIS comes with that version, but it would be under start, settings, control panel, add/remove programs, windows components. Be sure to only enable the services that you need [e.g. evaluate your need for smtp and ftp] and also secure your computer with all the microsoft patches, iislockdown with urlscan and the checklist which are all at [www.microsoft.com/security](http://www.microsoft.com/security) you could be very sorry if you don't. Antivirus and a firewall are good ideas too. Installing Apache free web server instead is also an option.
