> *when i try to edit or copy/replace/paste web pages or images from another*  
> *machine, even if i give an administrator privilege user, i get can't do it*  
> *files may be in use or no privilege across network, in this case the*  
network  
> *is my lan, so.....its a royal pain to have to go back to web server pc*  
and  
> *work the files from that end*  
> *is there a secure permission/access settings so i can update, etc web*  
files  
> *from another machine without unduly compromising security*

Basically you need to use an account from the web server. The web server has no knowledge of the remote accounts. How are you trying to connect to modify pages? The easiest thing to do might be to map a network drive on the remote machine to the wwwroot folder on the web server, and use an account from the web server to connect – you should have that option when you map the drive.
