In Outlook Express, when you compose a new email message, click on the menu option "View" and make sure the choice "All Headers" is on (checked)... now you should see a header field named "Bcc" – Blind Carbon Copy ... email addresses in this field receive the message, but they cannot see the others who were blind carbon copied. Many people who send email to a bunch of people put all the addresses in the BCC field so that none of the recipients knows it was sent to the others... woo hoo.
