Thanks for your response.

Yes, they are all in the same domain. And the IE options settings are the same as the working one.

The strange thing is they can work with some of the web pages. And even though they get a prompt to login, they can cancel it and they still can access the page. However if they try to logon by their domain name and password, the logon window won't accept it and still ask them to login. If they try three times, they account will be automatically locked. They have to ask help desk to enable their account.
