I Googled "eploy.akamaitechnologies.com" but unfortunately the few sites that come up are not in English. However, the sites are security sites and certainly nothing should be using your computer as a server without you knowing about it. Do the normal scanning for malware.

Go through these general malware removal steps systematically –

Include scanning with David Lipman's Multi\_AV and follow instructions to do all scans in Safe Mode. Please see the special Notes regarding using Multi\_AV in Vista.

The site is in German but David's tool is in English so don't let that worry you. Scroll all the way down to almost the bottom of the page and you'll see a box titled "Infos Zum Download – Multi-AV Scanning Tool". You'll see "Download von www pctipp.ch" and the live link to download Multi\_AV.

When all else fails, run HijackThis and post your log in one of the specialty forums listed at the first link above (not here, please).

Not all tools used will work in Vista and you will need to run them elevated. Since Vista is so new, it will be a while before removal techniques and tools are developed. If you are unable to remove the infection by following the general steps, register at one of the HijackThis forums as suggested.

Standard caveat: If the procedures look too complex – and there is no shame in admitting this isn't your cup of tea – take the machine to a professional computer repair shop (not your local version of BigComputerStore/GeekSquad). Please be aware that not all local shops are skilled at removing ma
