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I'd like to be able to identify that an "insert bulk" statement has occurred.

All of the SQL Statements that are run are identified solely by the permission event, we have to look at the text data column in Profiler to establish what the SQL was – but when we use BCP we get a few permission events but nothing legible in the text data column.

This isn't an issue with the functionality of BCP, it's an issue with the audit events that profiler picks up.

What I'd like is to find the same text captured in the permissions event (which is part of the audit set of events) as it captured by the SQL statements events (which logs the "insert bulk" statement and identifies the table and columns).
