Sounds like you might need to reregister SQL-DMO. From a command prompt run the following and see if that helps

```
regsvr32 "C:\Program Files\Microsoft SQL Server\80\Tools\Binn\sqlldmo.dll"
```

> I have tried to installed Microsoft SQL Server 2000 Desktop Engine SP3a

> and

> the full SQL server 2000 on a Win 2000 server with the same result. This

> is

> the problem I see...

>

> With SQL installed and server rebooted, initially I see the sqlmangr.exe

> icon in the sys tray. But when I put my icon on it, it disappears.

> However,

> sqlserver.exe is still running in the Task Manager and also shows as

> "Started" in the Service Control Panel.

>

> I am looking at this Win 2000 server remotely, through either Terminal

> Service or VNC - both method gave the same result above.

>

> I think there is a problem because I have a third party application that

> invokes SQL-DMO to create database. Let's call the program x.exe for

> simplicity. When I execute x.exe, I get a "SQL-DMO code execution

> error -

> Access Violation" and code 80040005

>

> I think my inability to invoke x.exe is tied to the sql server manager

> icon

> disappearing from the sys tray. In other words, there is something wrong

> with the sql server installation, although sql server installation log

> does

> not seem to indicate any problem.

>

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> your help is greatly appreciated.
>
