Hi Gopinath,

You cant give permission to developer to create a stored procedure under the ownership of DBO. The only option is let your developer create the stored procedures under his name. Later you can login as SA or user with db_owner rights and execute the below command to change the owner to dbo.

```
sp_changeobjectowner 'existingowner.procedurename','dbo'
```

This will make the object owner to dbo. If needed you can even write a script and schedule a job to change the owner daily once or twice.
