

Re: How to hide unauthorized databases with SQL 2005?

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VIEW ANY DATABASE is granted to public by default. If you want to remove this permission from userA:

```
USE master
DENY VIEW ANY DATABASE TO userA
```

Although the user still has VIEW ANY DATABASE via public role membership, the DENY takes precedence.

You could also REVOKE VIEW ANY DATABASE from public and then selectively grant that permission to users as you see fit.

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Hope this helps.
