I have no idea what you're asking here. Encryption is a feature of SQL Server 2005 so it is supported exactly the same way as all other SQL Server features. PSS will fully support it, encryption is included in Microsoft official training curriculums, Microsoft Consulting Service and our consulting partners will do encryption projects, etc. If you could explain what you're looking for it would be easier to answer.
