Hi all

Using SQL Server 2005, I create a new server login (logged in as sa) and map it to a database user and set its default schema to dbo.

Now when I open the database the newly created user is able to see (in SQL Server Management Studio GUI) and execute `_system_` stored procedures. All user created stored procedures can neither be seen nor executed.

I have only tried to execute `sys.sp_catalogs`, but in my opinion a new user should only have the right to connect and nothing else.

Does anyone know how to remove the permission to see and execute system stored procedures?

(I tried to delete the guest account but got an error saying that it could not be deleted but it was disabled in the database).
