thanks for your answer. I know that this is a solution but the problem is that, for ALTER AUTHORIZATION I need a login and a certificate inside the master database and also a master key.
I'd like to fairly avoid storing information of any kind inside master – regardless of what information this is. That's the reason why I was asking for a solution without a signed stored procedure.

If you prefer you can use impersonation in the procedure, that is EXECUTE AS.

I'm not sure that I understand your reluctance against storing information in master. After all, it is here you have information about logins, databases, server-level permissions, the service master key in master.
