Good2go (Good2go@xxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxx) writes:

That's the error I get when I try to install the workstation tools on the server. I can't get the management tools to install. Whenever I try to install them I get an "unknown error" message and in the setup logs, it tells me that not only is my account (that is the one I'm using) is not associated with a trusted connection, but neither is the sa account.

That message about trusted connections indicates that the installation is trying to log into SQL Server. But there should be no need to log in to install the tools – unless you have selected to install the sample databases, which for some strange reason appear under tools.
