So is Windows Authentication just for SQL running on a server and in a domain?

You can use Windows authentication in a workgroup, but a couple of stars need to be aligned for it to work. Users must have the same username and password on both machines. In Windows XP and Vista there is also a local security policy you need to change.

I would say that overall SQL authentication is the best choice for a workgroup.

I thought when you opened up the guest account that this would allow connectivity?

Guest account is only related to access between databases once you have logged in to SQL Server, and is not a matter here.
