We have a user who needs to do the following:

- 1) Truncate table
- 2) Create temp table

Anyone can create temp table. When you say TRUNCATE TABLE, is that on temp tables or regular tables?

Instead of granting this user DBO on the DB, what explicit permissions and/or role assignments can he be added to?

To do TRUNCATE TABLE on a permanent table, you need ALTER permission on that table, or membership in the db_ddladmin fixed database role.
