You might have to try to access the computer via an administrative share such as c\$ from another computer and then copy a batch file to it that uses secedit to reset the user rights via a startup script that you would have to configure remotely using gpedit.msc from the network computer and choosing the locked out computer as the one to manage Group Policy on. ----
