>Hi,

>

>Once you remove computer from domain, you can only use local computer

>accounts ("computer doesn't trust domain any more").

There are few accounts

>that are created when you install Windows. One of them is Administrator and

>another would be Guest account. If you know local administrator password,

>you can logon (enter Administrator for username and its password in password

>window). If you don't know the password, you will have to take computer to

>your domain administrator who should know the local administrator password

>and will be able to add computer back to domain.

>

>Note that you don't have to remove computer from domain to participate in

>Workgroup network. You can access shares and printer by e.g. \\server\share

>or \\192.168.0.1\share where 192.168.0.1 is IP of your server. Same can be

>applied to printers.
