It sounds like you want a firewall and not really looking to use IP security. IPSec is intended to validate traffic between two trusted peers, either for all traffic, or maybe for select traffic used by a client/server application. The Windows implementation does not support ranges (yet?) and it is near impossible to create/apply a policy with individual filters for each port (what did you want for ports 20k-64k?) both tcp and udp.
