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Do you have a firewall protecting your network? That should stop unauthorized connections and attempts to your server. If for some reason that is not possible in Windows 2000 you can configure an ipsec filtering policy using only allow and block filter actions to stop access from networks other than your subnet for ports/protocols that should not be accessed other than by your local network.

I've notice that there are some connection on the service ntfrs.exe from remote clients on the internet (usually from russians domains).

The Server is a Webserver with only IIS service and SMTP service. Is a PDC but there are no clients connected in the LAN and no other DC registered.

What are these strange connection? It could be a security problem? And why they connect to this service? It could be dangerous?
