When I try to open the path:

<\\<domain>\SysVol<domain>\Policies\{C1C213C3-2643-4467-B6A9-5AFC789D3A43}> manually on the server (using the Run menu command), I get an error message saying: 'No network provider accepted the given network path'.

So this is an occasional error, as I said before. Sometimes it happens every 5 minutes; other times, it will be fine for 15, but then show up again 5 minutes later. Not consistent at all.

I've checked the eventid site for those, and none of those issues seem to apply to me, and are mostly just for Windows XP.

Any other suggestions?
