> *2 certificate templates for Enterprise CAs. V2 templates give you the ability to edit and create new templates, the version 1 template which are essentially what were present for Win2K are not editable. Being editable allows for customizing things like CSP/key length, subject syntax, key usage, EKU, etc. Pretty much everything about the template is editable.*

> *Enterprise edition also allows for auto-enrollment to Windows XP and greater*
