desktop.

| > Today he had started flashget to download a file and just after that his  
| > internet connection failed, so the remote desktop session was  
disconnected  
| > (many hours passed since then and he is still offline PING!). A few  
| > minutes  
| > after  
| > he was disconnected, flashget found some more download mirrors and  
| > established about 50 TCP sessions rendering my internet connection very  
| > unstable for any new session attempt.

| > When his session is disconnected I cannot use remote control on it and  
my  
| > only option would be to logon to it. But when my friend is offline on  
the  
| > other side of the world and cannot unlock his session, my only option  
| > would  
| > be either to reset his password or to force logoff. I prefer not to do  
| > this.

| > Is it possible to create two passwords for his account (one for him and  
| > one  
| > for me, which I can use to unlock his session if any problem happens  
| > again)?
