This could be happening because your system is normally connected to a domain and you are currently not connected.

First make sure the system is connected to the network the domain resides on. If you are or believe there is not a problem there, try logging on locally. At the logon, you will see a drop down below the username and password fields, try changing that to <computer name> (this computer) where <computername> is the name of the computer). Use a user/password for the local machine and log in.

Once in, make sure the network card is functioning properly and verify it is set up to connect to the proper domain. R click my computer>Properties and click the Computer name tab. This will show the computer/domain information.
