>**** If the above does not pertain to you, then try the following ****

>

>Step #1

>

>Perform a Disk Cleanup:

>

>Go to Start > Programs > Accessories > System Tools > Disk Cleanup

>

>Step #2:

>

>Go to Start > Run and type: MSCONFIG , and hit enter.

>Select "Normal Startup", click "apply" and reboot.

>

>Step #3:

>

>1. Start the Administrative Tools utility in your Control Panel.

>2. Double-click Services.

>3. Right-click "Cryptographic Services", and then click Properties.

>4. Click "Automatic" for Startup type, and then click Start.

>5. Try installing the Updates again. If the problem persists, go to Step 6.

>6. Click Start, and then click Run.

>7. In the Open box, type: CMD , and then click OK.

>8. At the Command Prompt, type (or Copy & Paste) the following commands,

> each individually, pressing ENTER after each line:

>

> net stop cryptsvc

>

> ren %systemroot%\system32\catroot2 oldcatroot2

>

> net start cryptsvc

>

> Type EXIT to close the Command Prompt, and install the patch:

>

>**** *If installation continues to fail, try this
additional procedure *****

>

>*Click Start > Run and type: CMD , hit enter.*

>

>*In the Command Prompt window, type the following
commands,*

>*pressing ENTER after each line:*

>

>*net stop cryptsvc*

>

>*net start cryptsvc*

>

>*regsvr32 softpub.dll*

>

>*regsvr32 wintrust.dll*

>

>*regsvr32 initpki.dll*

>

>*regsvr32 dssenh.dll*

>

>*regsvr32 rsaenh.dll*

>

>*regsvr32 cryptdlg.dll*

>

>*EXIT*

>

>*Try installing the patch once again.*
