> >program then works, but only for that session. I have  
> >tried disabling every kind of security and I cannot get  
> >the browser to remember that I always want this to be  
> >allowed. How can I get around this?

> >Also there appears to be a problem with the popup  
> >blocker. When the popup blocker blocks a popup that you  
> >do want to see, it forces the browser to refresh. The  
> >refreshing is undesirable and causing issues.
