- > script or ActiveX control. Internet Explorer blocks the active content

- > will be able to view or use the Web page without using the active content.
- > Because active content is a potential hazard to your computer, you should
- > be certain that you trust the publisher of a script or ActiveX control
- > before you decide to give it access to your computer.

- > If you are certain that you want to allow the page to run scripts and
- > ActiveX controls on your computer, follow the steps below:

- > 1.. Click the Information Bar.
- > 2.. Click Allow blocked content.
- > Click Related Topics for information about how to decide if you should
- > trust a Web site or publisher.
