I have been reading this thread with interest since I am experiencing the same type of sharing problem between two machines Machine A can access the shares of Machine B but when B accesses A I get the logon error mentioned above.

Machine A has its shares defined. I go to A's folder options to uncheck the "use simple file sharing" option. A does not have a "Use Simple File Sharing" option! Its option list ends with "Show pop-up description for folder and desktop items" even though shares are defined.

Any advice is much appreciated. Thank you – Steve
