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You need to disable Simple File Sharing on your computer to see the security tab via Explorer. Once you do that you may need to first take ownership as an administrator and then grant yourself permissions to access the folders/files. The owner of a folder/file can always change permissions on it and administrators can always take ownership. The links below explain in more detail.
