I'm currently trying to rollout outlook 2003 to all of the machines in my company. In this process I'm using an .mst file that is automatically creating the user profile and setting them up to use exchange. Along side this process I'm attempting to release an active directory based signature file to each user. I have a third party script that is able to accomplish this on the command line but I'm not able to succeed in doing this using group policy and I really don't want to have to run the script on the command line for each user.

The problem is that the user profile doesn't get created until the user

actually opens up the Outlook for the first time, at this point the profile is created and setup to use exchange to receive mail. Once this has taken place the command line script for the signature file works without a problem. The issue that I'm facing is that with group policy the command line script is being ran prior to the profile creation, and this causes the script to fail.

The solution I'm looking for is in regards to constraining the group policy object from running until the profile is created. Is there a way to make the OU dependent upon a particular file existing on a user profile (the .pst file in this case)? Any help would be extremely appreciated.
