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As I said it is False positive by Spybot, because SpyAd2 is using the choice.exe processor and Spybot is detecting this and thinking it is an intrusion and alert you.

Are you running Spybot in Tea Timer?.

If you found the SpyAd useful and protecting you and children from bad sites, try to excluding it from further scan, it is the same when you have An Anti-virus Firewall that disable windows firewall, spybot alert you that it detect an intrusion or bad entries, nothing wrong with Spybot, it just tell you to be aware of that.

Windows XP users) have reported that the IE-SPYAD block list does not show up in the Restricted sites list of Internet Explorer."
